WILDLIFE DISEASES & DIAGNOSTICS

Understand major diseases affecting African wildlife, learn about testing methods, epidemiology, and disease control strategies. Explore the complex wildlife-livestock-human health interface.

WILDLIFE CONSERVATION

Gain insight into **conservation strategies** used on **Big 5 reserves**, learn about habitat management, anti-poaching efforts, and **breeding programmes** for endangered species.

Assist the vets providing **primary animal healthcare** in rural, underprivileged communities. The CVC is a non-profit organisation providing primary veterinary health care to animals in disadvantaged communities and education to pet owners and subsistence farmers.

OTHER INFORMATION

CURRENCY

ZAR (South African Rand). If you need to change your currency into Rands, please do it at Johannesburg airport (OR Tambo) as this is the only place you will be able to do it.

If you plan to use your bank card whilst in South Africa, please remember to let your bank know that you will be using your card outside of your country.



WASHING MACHINE

A washing machine is available at most places during your trip. This will be at your own cost (approximately R100 per wash).

WIFI

Wifi availability will be limited due to us being in remote locations. It is recommended that you purchase your own local sim card at Johannesburg International Airport if you require constant internet access.

WEATHER

It can get cold here in Winter, so you need to bring some warm clothes with you. In the mornings and at night it can be very cold (below 5 degrees Celsius) but mostly during the day the temperature is mild to warm (18-26 degrees Celsius).



EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES INCLUDED IN YOUR PROGRAMME

CONSERVATION ON BIG 5 GAME RESERVE

This is what could be included in your time on the reserve:

- Telemetry Training Track wildlife using advanced techniques
- Camera Trap Monitoring Set up, collect, and analyse images for species data
- **Vehicle-Based Game Counts** Learn population monitoring methods and predator-prey dynamics
- Animal Tracking Identify spoor, behaviour markers, and dung middens
- Bird Ringing & Identification Assist ornithologists with tagging and cataloguing
- Anti-Poaching Insights Spend time with the APU and learn about cutting-edge security methods
- Conservation Interventions (when available) Witness or assist in activities like rhino dehorning, animal collaring, or translocation.
- **Presentations** animal management, reserve management, carrying capacity, security and technology used in animal management and diseases.

K9 CONSERVATION UNIT

Spend the morning with **highly trained anti-poaching dogs**Learn how K9 teams are used to **detect snares**, **track poachers**, **and protect endangered species**.

REHABILITATION CENTRE

Learn all about the centre and the vital role they play in breeding rare and endangered species as well as what is being done to rehabilitate wildlife that has been abandoned, injured or poisoned.

SAFARI GAME DRIVE

You will have the opportunity to enjoy a many guided game drives in the Kruger National Park with your Live4now guide. This will maximise your chances of seeing the **Big 5** and more

HELICOPTER FLIP (Weather dependent)

HEALTH & SAFETY

- Live4now staff will be with you from airport pick up to drop off.

- You will be required to sign an indemnity form on arrival.
- Hospitals and Doctors are located in the nearest towns.
- Malaria: We advise that you get advice regarding anti-malarial medication from your doctor.
- You should consult your doctor for advice on vaccinations you might need before travelling to South Africa.
- You will need to get rabies vaccinations before coming on the trip.

- Copy of travel insurance documents.
- Money for washing your clothes etc
